Trajectories of Resilience and Complex Comorbidity

- Foundational cohort for a series of studies funded by VA, DoD and NIH
 - Funded by VA Health Service Research and Development in 2009
 - Two primary VA institutions involved in data collection and analysis
 - Collaboration with Joint Trauma System
 - No references provided adequate guidance in 2009
 - Primary guidance was talking with, and incorporating DoD investigators in the process

Subsequent Studies

- Chronic Effects of Neurotrauma Consortium: Epidemiology Study (VA+DoD funding; 2014)
- Military Extremity Trauma Amputation/Limb Salvage 2 (DoD funding; 2016)
- Epilepsy Research Program Studies (DoD funding; 2016, 2018)



DoD Trauma Registry (DoDTR)

- VA-DoD Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) slow the first time—easier thereafter
 - Multiple revisions by DoD and VA Office of General Counsel
 - Follow up with MOA and ongoing discussions with DoD collaborators.

Transition of DoDTR to Defense Health Agency: August 2018


- Early uncertainty on the part of Joint Trauma System and DHA re: process
 - Early requests were not received
 - Slow progress during the transition

Approach

- Work proactively with JTS staff to ensure data request tracker/DoDTR data request form complete early on
- Frequent communication with DHA data team once analyst assigned

New Hiccups

Data Sharing Agreement Process when linking with DoD data from DaVINCI



Resolution

- Early issues resolved via collaboration and communication
 - Incorporate DoD partners in the research
 - Mutual respect
- Current issues not yet resolved, but progressing
 - Start processes as early as possible!!

Implications for Research Program

- Time is money
 - Need to plan on slow start up even if you start early
 - Issues/Concerns for staffing stability
- Different implications depending on funding mechanism

• Slow start up may require "double time" later

Implications for Collaboration

- Positive Impact!
- Collaboration is the answer...can make or break the study



Proposed Fixes

 Clear process flow/guidelines developed by incorporating DHA data team, JTS, VA ORD, VINCI/DaVINCI, VA and DoD researchers

 Ability to develop/retain repository of merged DoD-VA health system data for "umbrella" studies
